



## Adrian Brown

MUSICAL DIRECTOR

Adrian graduated from the Royal Academy of Music in London. He studied and then worked with conductor Sir Adrian Boult and is the only British conductor to have reached the finals of the Karajan Conductors' Competition.

He has conducted the Berlin Philharmonic Orchestra, the St Petersburg Philharmonic Orchestra and the Camerata Salzburg, one of Europe's foremost chamber orchestras. He has also worked with many leading British orchestras including the City of Birmingham Symphony Orchestra, the BBC Symphony Orchestra, the BBC Scottish Symphony Orchestra, Stoneleigh Youth Orchestra and the London Sinfonietta.

Adrian was one of a hundred musicians presented with a prestigious Classic FM Award at their 10<sup>th</sup> Birthday Honours Celebration in June 2002.

## The Society

The Huntingdonshire Philharmonic was founded in 1977, since when it has developed a wide reputation for the variety and quality of its performances. The orchestra is now one of the larger amateur orchestras in the region and the choir is highly regarded for its readiness to tackle an ambitious range of repertoire in various styles from all periods. Our concerts cover a range of music from the 18th century through to the present day, including new works by contemporary composers. This enables the society to learn and grow and gives our audiences a great and varied experience.

Rehearsals are held throughout the year in term time at Godmanchester Community Primary School, Park Lane, Godmanchester from 7.45 to 9.45 pm.

## Dreamdrops

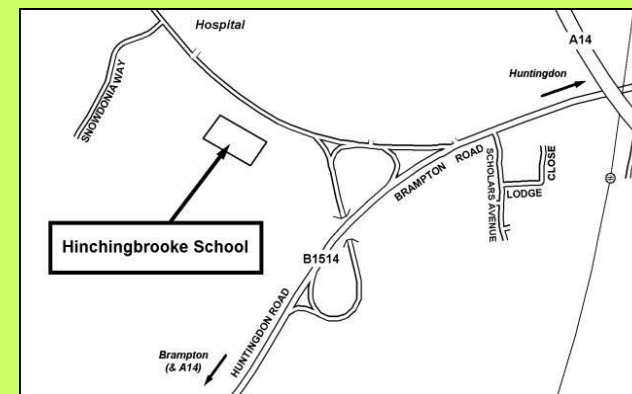

## Venue

Concerts normally take place at the Performing Arts Centre (PAC), Hinchingsbrooke School, off Brampton Road, Huntingdon.

Facilities include a large free car park and a licensed bar serving drinks and hot beverages both before the performance and during the interval. The building is fully accessible to people with disabilities.



## Ticket Prices

Concert tickets at the PAC are priced at £12. Concessionary tickets (under-18s and students) are priced at £6. A free ticket is available to the companion of any disabled person who needs help in order to attend events.
